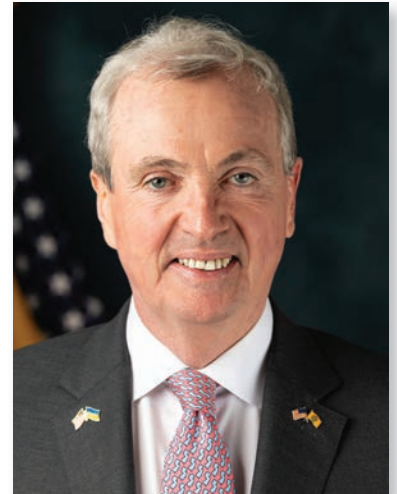

AFTER HIGH SCHOOL

In New Jersey, students have access to a variety of postsecondary institutions, including two-year community colleges, four-year colleges and universities, and career schools. These institutions provide highly diversified programs of study to meet the individual needs of students as they prepare for future careers.

TWO-YEAR COLLEGES

Two-year colleges offer students the opportunity to earn an associate degree, including the Associate in Arts, the Associate in Science and the Associate in Applied Science. Your education at a two-year school can provide you with specialized training that can be immediately applied to a job following graduation. It can also prepare you for transfer to a four-year institution where you can complete your bachelor's degree.

New Jersey's county and community colleges primarily serve the residents of their respective county. In most instances, students enroll in the institution that serves their county. However, if you live in a county without a community college, or if your college doesn't offer the program you want, you can attend one of the other community colleges.

FOUR-YEAR COLLEGES & UNIVERSITIES

New Jersey's four-year colleges and universities grant a bachelor's degree, which is also called a baccalaureate. A few offer an associate, and most have graduate degree programs. Four-year colleges and universities generally offer a broad curriculum, unless the school specializes in a certain area of study, such as music.

Graduates typically receive a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree. Some New Jersey colleges offer degrees with specialized titles such as a Bachelor of Science in Engineering or a Bachelor of Fine Arts.

TRANSFERRING FROM A TWO-YEAR SCHOOL

The New Jersey Presidents' Council approved the Comprehensive State-Wide Transfer Agreement. Under the provisions of this agreement, an Associate of Arts (AA) or Associate of Science (AS) degree from a New Jersey community college will be fully transferable as the first two years of a baccalaureate degree program and will be considered to have completed all lower division general education requirements. CAREER SCHOOLS

Career schools train students for a specific vocation. Programs of study are usually, but not always, shorter in duration than traditional colleges — ranging from six months to one year. Programs range from automotive repair to culinary arts, from electronics to paralegal, from gaming and design to health care. Career schools can also serve as a stepping stone to entry into a two-year or four-year degree program.

The **New Jersey College Promise** offers an affordable pathway to a college degree. Together, the **Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG)** and the **Garden State Guarantee (GSG)** programs promise transparent, predictable pricing for up to four years of college here in New Jersey.



Community College Opportunity Grant

Community College Opportunity Grants make community colleges affordable for New Jerseyans. CCOG awards pay for the cost of tuition and approved educational fees for New Jersey residents with an annual adjusted gross income (AGI) between \$0 and \$65,000. New Jersey residents with AGIs between \$65,001 and \$80,000 will pay reduced tuition costs after up to one-half of the maximum CCOG award available at their community college is applied. New Jersey residents with AGIs between \$80,001 and \$100,000 will pay reduced tuition costs after up to one-third of the maximum CCOG award available at their community college is applied. The CCOG covers the cost of tuition and fees per year that are not already covered by federal and state financial aid or scholarships.

To be eligible for the Community College Opportunity Grant, students must:

- ✓ Be a New Jersey resident with an Adjusted Gross Income between \$0 and \$100,000
- ✓ Complete the FAFSA or NJ Alternative Financial Aid Application by applicable state deadlines
- ✓ Enroll in at least six (6) credits per semester at one of New Jersey's community colleges
- ✓ Have not yet earned a college degree
- ✓ Make satisfactory academic progress

Garden State Guarantee



New Jersey residents who attend a New Jersey four-year public institution of higher education and have an annual AGI between \$0 and \$65,000 will attend tuition-free during their third (60-89 credits) and fourth (90-128 credits) years of study, because the Garden State Guarantee provides a net price of \$0 for tuition and fees during those years. Students in their third and fourth years at one of New Jersey's four-year public colleges or universities with AGIs between \$65,001 and \$80,000 will pay a discounted net price of no more than \$7,500 for tuition and fees per year and those with AGIs between \$80,001 and \$100,000 will pay a discounted net price of no more than \$10,000 for tuition and fees per year. The GSG covers the cost of tuition and fees that are not already covered by federal and state financial aid or scholarships.

To be eligible for the Community College Opportunity Grant, students must:

- ✓ Be a New Jersey resident with an Adjusted Gross Income between \$0 and \$100,000
- ✓ Complete the FAFSA or NJ Alternative Financial Aid Application by applicable state deadlines
- ✓ Enroll full-time (at least 12 credits per semester) at a New Jersey public four-year college or university
- ✓ Have not yet earned a Bachelor's degree
- ✓ Make satisfactory academic progress

In addition to New Jersey's College Promise programs, the State offers several other grants and scholarship opportunities.



Tuition Aid Grant (TAG) offers need-based assistance to New Jersey students enrolled at approved New Jersey higher education institutions, covering a substantial portion of tuition for nearly one-third of all full-time undergraduate students.

New Jersey is a leader in delivering financial aid, awarding one of the nation's highest amounts of State-funded, need-based grant dollars per undergraduate student. Since 1978, the TAG program has played a central role in New Jersey's commitment to making postsecondary education more affordable and supporting economic mobility. Eligible students can receive TAG while studying for degrees from New Jersey institutions in all sectors – public, private, two-year, and four-year colleges and universities.

EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY FUND (EOF)

The New Jersey EOF provides meaningful, supportive access to higher education for New Jersey residents to attend one of the Fund's participating colleges or universities. EOF is a campus-based program and admission into EOF is conducted at the campus level.

NEW JERSEY STUDENT TUITION ASSISTANCE REWARD SCHOLARSHIP (NJ STARS)

STARS is a merit-based scholarship that provides New Jersey's highest achieving students with free tuition at their home county colleges.

NEW JERSEY STUDENT TUITION ASSISTANCE REWARD SCHOLARSHIP (NJ STARS II)

Successful NJ STARS scholars who transfer to a New Jersey four-year public or private college or university can earn additional funds in pursuit of a bachelor's degree.

NEW JERSEY GOVERNOR'S INDUSTRY VOCATIONS SCHOLARSHIP (NJ-GIVS)

GIVS are administered by HESAA and funded by the Schools Development Authority. This scholarship benefits women and students of color pursuing a postsecondary certificate or degree program in a construction-related field.

WORLD TRADE CENTER (WTC)

The WTC scholarship benefits dependent children and surviving spouses of New Jersey residents who were killed or died as a result of injuries sustained by the terrorist attacks against the U.S. on September 11, 2001.

SURVIVOR TUITION BENEFITS (STB)

STB is for eligible children and surviving spouses of New Jersey firefighters, emergency service workers and law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty.

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER MEMORIAL (LEOM)

LEOM Scholarship benefits dependent children of New Jersey law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty.

GOVERNOR'S URBAN SCHOLARSHIP (GUS)

The GUS is a merit-based scholarship program that benefits students in New Jersey's economically-challenged communities. See page 71 for full listing of municipalities.

NJ FOSTER CARE SCHOLARS (NJFC)

Provides funding for eligible youth who have experienced a CP&P out-of-home placement, CP&P independent living arrangement or transitional living program and are seeking a post-secondary degree at an accredited two-year or four-year college, university, or a career/technical school.

NJBEST 529 COLLEGE SAVINGS SCHOLARSHIP

This tax-free scholarship is for beneficiaries of an NJBEST account who attends a college in New Jersey.

NEW JERSEY SHOPPING SHEET

To help boost transparency in the net cost of college, New Jersey now requires each institution to provide a **SHOPPING SHEET** to students. As shown, students and their families can now compare college costs in an **APPLES-TO-APPLES** format.

This template illustrates both the total cost of college and the **NET COST** which families have to pay (or borrow in student loans) after all other financial aid has been applied.

Depending on your school selection, you will want to be familiar with **both** the **2-year** and **4-year** NJ Financial Aid Shopping Sheet formats.

Understanding Student Loans

Millions of students nationwide, including those who receive grants and scholarships, borrow student loans to help pay for their education.

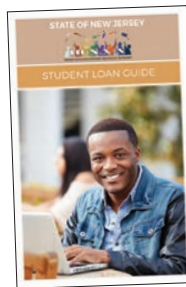
There are two primary types of student loans: federal and supplemental. Federal student loans offer fixed interest rates and favorable terms, including the option to defer repayment until you have completed your degree. Federal loans include the Direct Loan for students, the Federal PLUS loan for parents, and the Federal PLUS loan for graduate and professional students. Students may borrow Direct Loans regardless of financial need; however, those with need may receive a subsidized loan. With a subsidized loan, the federal government will pay the interest that accumulates on the loan while you are enrolled in college, for a short period after you graduate (grace period), and during periods of authorized deferment. For unsubsidized Direct Loans and Federal PLUS loans, interest is the responsibility of the borrower.

HESAA makes supplemental loans available through the NJCLASS program, after the student has exhausted eligibility for all other forms of financial aid and federal Direct Loans. NJCLASS supplemental family loans offer low interest rates to borrowers meeting both income and credit worthiness requirements. NJCLASS can be used to pay a portion of the tuition or the entire cost of college.

New Jersey residents can use NJCLASS to attend any approved college in the nation. Non-New Jersey residents attending a New Jersey college can also use NJCLASS.

BORROW WISELY

College costs are rising, and more students are turning to loans to pay for educational expenses. Borrowing may be a necessity, but students are advised to borrow as little as possible. Borrowing should be a last resort after all student aid is exhausted. Student loans can help you achieve your educational goals, but don't over borrow. A good guideline is to limit your student loan borrowing to what your future earnings will allow you to repay. Plan in advance for repayment. Determining your potential debt and your expected income allows you to make responsible financial choices about your future.

8 STEPS TO APPLY FOR FEDERAL AND STATE STUDENT AID

1: ASK FOR FREE HELP

Free help is available any time during the application process! Do not be taken in by scammers charging money to help you apply for student aid.

2: KNOW YOUR 2024-2025 STATE DEADLINES

- First-time NJ State Grant Applicants
Fall/Spring Applicants – September 15, 2024
- Spring Only – February 15, 2025
- Renewal for State Aid Recipients – April 15, 2025

Your college may have deadlines too.

3: CREATE A FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FSA) LOGIN

Create your user ID and Password by going to www.studentaid.gov/fsa-id/sign-in/landing and create an FSA ID. The student and all information contributors will need to create their own FSA ID at this website. All parties will use their login to access the FAFSA at www.studentaid.gov, and connect to their Federal Tax Information (FTI) and sign the FAFSA.

4: COMPLETE YOUR FAFSA

To start your FAFSA go to www.studentaid.gov. The student will login with their FSA ID. Provide consent for the IRS to use their Federal Tax Information (FTI) to complete the FAFSA! If you are unable to use FTI, you will need to collect your 2022 tax returns and other records of income.

NJ Dreamers must complete the NJ Alternative Application only. Go to www.hesaa.org/Pages/NJAlternativeApplication.aspx to complete your application.

5: YOUR FAFSA RESULTS

The U.S. Department of Education will display your FAFSA Submission Summary (FSS) – the result of processing your FAFSA. Review your FSS, If required, you can submit corrections online at www.studentaid.gov. Your complete FSS will contain your Student Aid Index (SAI) which determines your federal student aid eligibility.

6: YOUR NJ STATE AID RESULTS

HESAA will send an email to the email address listed on the FAFSA, which will contain your NJ State/ HESAA ID. You will be instructed to create an NJFAMS User ID and password to log into your NJFAMS student portal. Here, you will find your “To Do List” and “Award and Eligibility” information as well as other functions to assist you with your State aid process.

7: VERIFY YOUR ANSWERS

If you are selected for federal verification, your school’s financial aid office will ask you to submit tax returns and other documents, as appropriate. Be sure to meet the school’s deadlines. (To request an IRS tax return transcript go to www.irs.gov - it’s free) The State of New Jersey may also request documents to verify information reported on the FAFSA. HESAA will ask you to submit a tax return transcript and other documents as appropriate.

8: GET AWARD QUESTIONS ANSWERED

All Students: Go to your college financial aid portal about the aid being offered.

First-Time Applicants: Review award letters from schools to compare amounts and types of aid being offered. Decide which school to attend based on a combination of (a) how well the school fits your needs and (b) its affordability after all aid is taken into account.

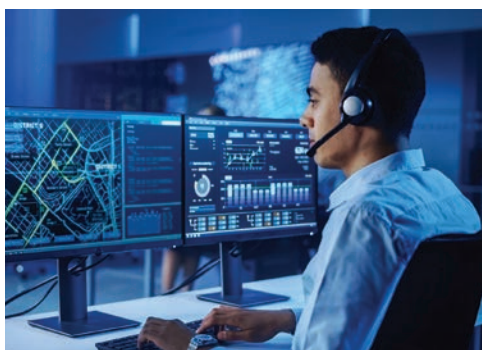

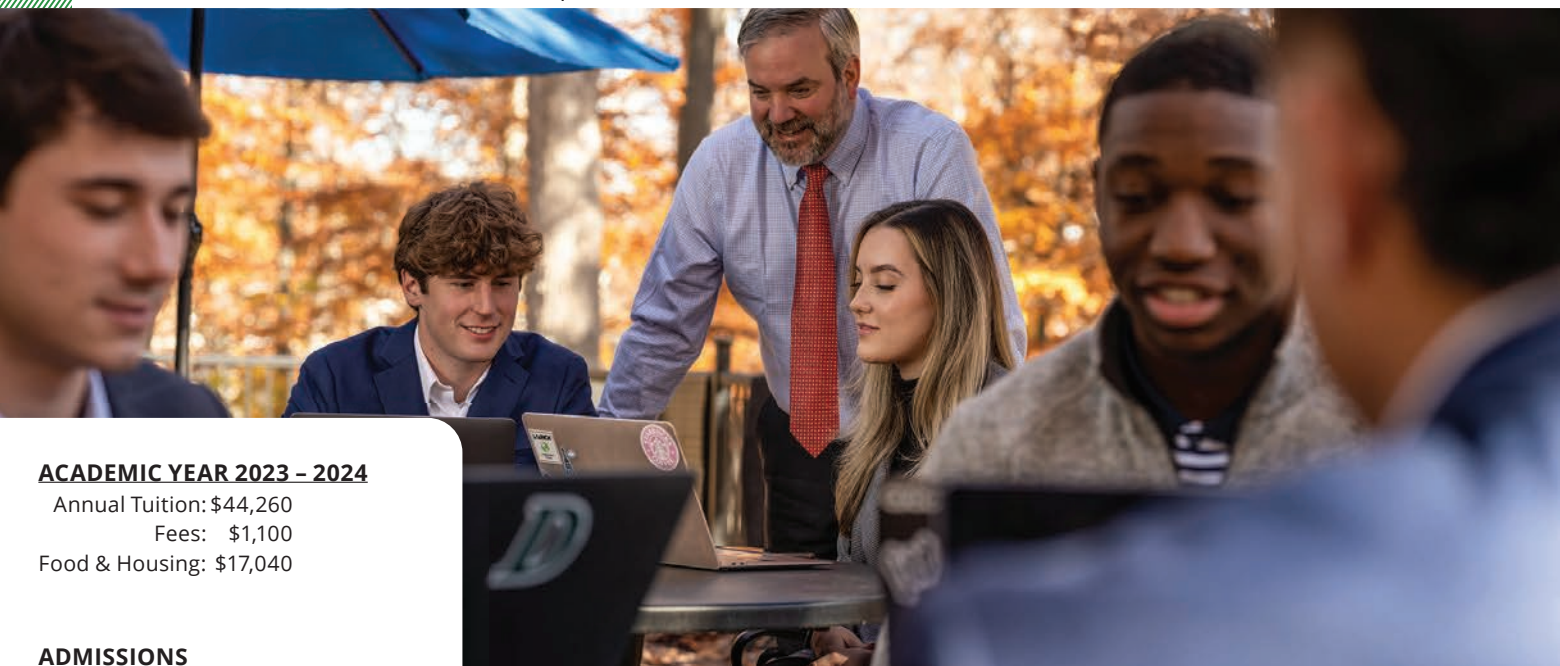

According to a Stacker.com review of a recent study by Georgetown University, Eastwick College is among the nation's top 100 two-year colleges for return on investment (also known as ROI).
